
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

- •It is one of the oldest type of archaeological artefact with 1,00,000 year old beads made from nassarius shells thought to be oldest known jewellery.
- •In most cultures jewellery can be understood as a status symbol for its material properties, its patterns, or for meaningful symbols.



Materials and methods



- In creating jewellery, gemstones, coins, or other precious items are often used, and they are typically set into precious metals.
- Beads are frequently used in jewellery. These may be made of glass, gemstones, metal, wood, shells, clay and polymer clay.
- Silversmiths, goldsmiths, and lapidaries methods include forging, casting, soldering or welding, cutting, carving and "cold-joining" using adhesives, staples and rivets to assemble parts.





GOLD JEWELLERY




- The history of gold jewellery goes back at least 5,000-6,000 years.

- Venice was the first diamond trading capital, But with passage of time, Bruges and Paris became the important diamond hubs.





working women.





• In North India diamond jewellery is more preferred.


√In South India gold jewellery is prefered more.
